Scientific name: Carcharhinus melanopterus

Adults: Up to 6 feet (2m) in length Newborns: About 16-20 inches in length

Female blacktip sharks incubate their young for up to 16 months before giving birth. They usually produce litters of 2-4 shark pups.

MCN Red List Status.

Often caught and wasted as by catch from hories of other fisheries. Like many other species of Shark, blacktip populations are declining.

Near Threatened

Most commonly encountered species of shark in tropical Indo-Pacific reefs. Researchers studying the population off Palmyra Atoll in the central Pacific found the Blacktips living there have a home range of around .21 square miles, among the smallest of any shark species.

> The Blacktip is a species of requiem shark. It gets its name from the prominent black tips on its fins.
